## Salaries for elected County officials approved

At their April 15 meeting, the Appanoose County Board of Supervisors reduced the percentage increases recommended by the County Compensation Board and approved the new salary adjustments for all elected county officials. The Compensation Board had recommended a 10% across the board increase, except for an 8% boost for Supervisors. Instead, Supervisors

voted for a 2% raise for all offices, except in the case of their own salaries, for which they approved a 1.6% increase.

When compared to the other counties in the State of Iowa, Appanoose ranks 61st in population. Here are the current salaries, the rank for each in parenthesis when compared to the other 98 counties, the percentage of increase approved, and the

new salaries effective July 1, 2024. Auditor: \$72,333.68

(59th) 2% to \$73,780.35 County Attorney: \$119,758.70 (46th) 2% to \$122,153.87 Recorder: \$69,794.30

(67th) 2% to \$71,190.19 Sheriff: \$99,872.71 (64th) 2% to \$101,870.16 Supervisor: \$35,006.33 (65th) to \$35,566.43 Chairperson Stipend

\$1,000 (unchanged) Treasurer: \$69,792.30 (68th) 2% to \$71,190.19

The total of these salaries is rounded to \$466,560, which ranks as 57th statewide. Polk County is both the most populated and ranks #1 for highest salaries of elected officials. Adams County is the least populated, but Ringgold County comes in at 99th in salaries for elected positions.
