The van also offers free rides to pharmacies in Decatur County to pick up prescriptions. This service was implemented as a direct result of public input, and addresses a major issue with transportation for Decatur County residents. To schedule a ride, call 1-844-782-5420. Scheduling is done on a first come, first serviced basis, and a 24 hour notice is requested. Transportation is offered between 8:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. from Monday-Friday.

Endocrinology, Diabetes Education, and General/Vascular Surgery. We're proud to provide a wellrounded approach to serving patients living with diabetes and other endocrine disorders. In our region, access to Endocrinologists and Certified Diabetic Educators is very limited, but our comprehensive diabetes management program is available on-site at Decatur County Hospital. Dr. Haytham Kawji, MD is a board endocrinologist certified who visits the DCH Outpatient Clinic four (4) consecutive days each month

and specializes in treating

diabetes, thyroid disorders,

parathyroid disorders, ad-

renal gland disorders, pituitary gland disorders, osteoporosis, hypogonadism, and more. Our Certified Diabetic Educator, Linda Klejch, visits every Tuesday to provide guidance on lifestyle changes, medications, and tracking devices that may help you better manage your diabetes.

If you have an endocrine disorder that causes a need to remove your thyroid, we also offer that surgical service on site in our top-of-the-line surgical center. Dr. Edwin Wehling, General/Vascular Surgeon, works directly with Dr. Kawji to perform thyroidectomies when it is in the best interest of the patient.

General/Vascular Surgery: Dr. Edwin Wehling, DO, is our General and Vascular surgeon who offers a range of surgical services on-site in our 2 (two) surgical suites. Surgery services at DCH include hernia repair, biopsies, excision of lesions, laparoscopic procedures (gall bladder, appendix, and colon resection). Nissen Fundoplication for GERD, colonoscopies, endoscopies, diagnosis and treatment of all vascular disease, angioplasty, bypass, and more.

Gynecology and Uro-Gynecology. Women have specific health needs, which require special care. Dr. Earle M. South Central Iowa Community Action Program (SCICAP) is still taking applications for the 2023-2024 Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program. This program is funded by the Department of Health and Human Services through the Iowa Department of Human Rights, Division of Community Action Agencies, and has been established to help qualifying low-income Iowa homeowners and renters pay for a portion of their primary heating costs.

The SCICAP Outreach Location for Decatur County will be taking applications Monday, Wednesday and Friday 8:00AM- 12:00PM and Monday and Friday 1:00PM -4:30PM. Applications will be taken through April 30, 2024 at 306 N Main St. Leon, IA.

Applicants will need to furnish some form of identification, a copy of their most recent heating, electric bill, social security card documentation for all household members, and proof of all household members' gross income for the past thirty days or for the past calendar year.

This program is not designed to pay a household's total energy costs. The program will provide supplemental assistance based on several factors. Those factors include total household income, household size, dwelling type, and type of heating fuel, among others.

Eligibility for participation is established according to the following federal income guidelines:

The motion to enter the closed session was carried, with a subsequent motion by Graham/Fulkerson to return to open session at 9:09 a.m., also carried.

A decision emerged as the board approved an indefinite unpaid suspension for an employee until evaluation and successful completion of treatment has occurred. The motion, made by Graham/Fulkerson, also included the requirement for the employee to execute a release of information allowing the evaluator

to provide copies of all evaluation and treatment results to the Board of Supervisors via the County Auditor. The decision further stipulated that random urinalysis/swab tests may/shall be administered after completion of treatment, with the motion carried.
